
Grade 7 Class Newsletter November 2024

REMINDERS:

- Students should be reading regularly for 15 30 minutes per night.
- Students are expected to complete 20 30 minutes of homework every night. This can consist of revision of classwork, (especially math) working on projects and finishing classwork.
- All students have signed into Google Classroom. I will post assignments and notifications, if needed.
- Spelling lists should be studied every night.
- Please sign the homework planners every day. Students are
 encouraged to use their planners as organizational tools,
 noting any homework tasks, reminders and work due. They
 are also useful for communication between home and school.

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING:

Math - Measurement, angles, polygons, using protractors, compasses and calculators, estimation, line segments and constructions. Regular math worksheet drills are used to reinforce and consolidate basic skills.

Reading - Novel study: "A Wrinkle in Time", reading with others, independent reading.

Writing - Journals, short stories, School-Wide Write, spelling and grammar activities.

Art/ADST - Papier mache, painting with acrylics, Christmas crafts.

Science - Atoms and molecules, compounds, food chemistry.

Christian Education - Oral presentation - "The Lives of Saints" - Students will share their findings on their chosen saints.
